WORLD-CLASS TENNIS IN SAUDI ARABIA: THE DIRIYAH TENNIS CUP PRESENTED BY ARAMCO IS BACK!

Finally! After three years, the Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by Aramco returns. As part of the Diriyah Season, twelve of the best players in the world will take to the court at the UNESCO world heritage site, intent on thrilling thousands of fans in Saudi Arabia once again. The first edition in 2019 was already historic, but from December 8-10, 2022, the level will be raised again. The tournament will take place over three days, with a star-studded field of players battling for the title: defending champion Daniil Medvedev, Olympic champion Alexander Zverev, Stefanos Tsitsipas, Nick Kyrgios, Andrey Rublev, Matteo Berrettini, Taylor Fritz, Cameron Norrie, Hubert Hurkacz, Dominic Thiem, Stan Wawrinka and Dominic Stricker form an exceptional line-up!

The first four seeded players will receive a bye in the first round. The first-round matches and the subsequent quarter-finals will all be played on the first day of the tournament, Thursday December 8. That means there will be a total of eight matches and every player will grace the court on day one! But that's not all: this year's Diriyah Tennis Cup takes another step forward from

2019 with the addition of a doubles tournament as well as the singles.

It will be the first time that doubles will be presented at a professional tournament in Saudi Arabia! Those players eliminated from the singles on the first day will start their own doubles tournament on Friday, giving them an extra chance to win the Diriyah Tennis Cup in doubles. The semi-finals of both singles and doubles will

be held on Friday. On Saturday December 10, the singles final, the doubles final and a spectacular exhibition with the best players of Saudi Arabia are on the schedule. And on our mini courts the fans can try playing tennis for themselves!

Saudi Arabian Sports Minister, HRH Prince Abdulaziz bin Turki Al Faisal, said: "We are extremely pleased to welcome world-class tennis back to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. The




STEFANOS TSITSIPAS

Spectacular tennis with Stefanos! The “Great Greek” has set himself big goals for the Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by Aramco and we are sure that fans have good reason to be excited! Time to get to know him in advance.

Tsitsipas is one of those players who combine elegance and intensity in their style of play, creating a very special atmosphere. He is the top-ranked Greek of all time and achieved his career-high No. 3 for the first time in August 2021. No other player won more matches in 2022 than Tsitsipas.



Why are you competing at the Diriyah Tennis Cup in Saudi Arabia?

“I am happy they are introducing a big event like the Diriyah Tennis Cup to the heart of Saudi Arabia, where the Kingdom’s first city was founded. I think it makes for an exciting event that we’re not used to playing tennis in this part of the world, and now we get the opportunity to present ourselves there to fans and people that love the sport, and to show them the high quality of tennis we are capable of playing.”

What are your expectations for the Diriyah Tennis Cup?

“I’m going to give a good show. I’m going to fight. For me, this is an opportunity to show my best abilities as an athlete and the fact that I’m doing it in Saudi Arabia for the first time, it really means a lot. THE DEFENDING

Champion

WILL THE DEFENDING CHAMPION BE BACK ON TOP?

None of the players has such a precise task as Daniil Medvedev. Because if things went his way, he would take home the title of the Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by Aramco once again, as he did in the first edition in 2019. And that doesn't seem so unlikely, but the competition is strong. Daniil Medvedev has also developed over the past three years and shows week after week that he belongs to the world's best. Medvedev crowned himself a Grand Slam champion at last year's US Open and spent a total of 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022.

"I really enjoyed my first time in Saudi Arabia. I played very well there and then had probably my best ever season up to that point. It brought me a lot of confidence for the season to come and that is what I'm going to try to do this season", Medvedev explained in his tournament preview and added: "Three years ago they had a fantastic village to celebrate the Diriyah Season. It was great fun and there were a lot of things to do. I'm sure they'll do it again." The defending champion is back to compete in Diriyah once more! 🍷


ANDREY RUBLEV

Red-hot RUBLEV WANTS IT ALL!

Andrey Rublev is on form in 2022! He has already won four ATP titles this year and has been one of the world's top players for several years. At the end of the season he reached the semi-finals of the NITTO ATP Finals in Torino. For more than three years he has been one of the hardest hitters on tour – there is hardly a player who accelerates the ball like Andrey Rublev. The 25-year-old, who has also reached 6 Grand Slam quarter-finals and won the gold medal in mixed doubles at the Tokyo Olympics alongside Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova, is really excited about his trip to the Kingdom and has a lot to say!

What makes the Diriyah Tennis Cup so important for you, especially in your off season?

“Sometimes when you finish a season and for eight weeks you don't play tournaments, you just work and work and then start to feel a bit stressed or nervous because you don't know what to expect, if you are improving or not. These kinds of events, like the Diriyah Tennis Cup, help you to check your own level because you play against other world class players. At least you can understand how you feel against them and you have enough time to change something before the upcoming season starts.” 🎾

FROM CALIFORNIA TO DIRIYAH

- During the COVID-19 pandemic, he teamed up with social media influencer Addison Rae to win a Nintendo Mario Tennis tournament and donate \$1 million to No Kid Hungry, which works to end child hunger in the USA.

Taylor Fritz from the United States had an extremely successful 2022 – it was the best season of his career! In front of his family and friends, the Californian won his first Masters title at his home tournament in Indian Wells. With this success behind him, he showed more fantastic performances and also qualified for the NITTO ATP Finals in Torino. There the American defeated Rafael Nadal for the second time this year, reached the semis and lost in a very tight encounter against Novak Djokovic.

“Now I’m looking forward to playing in front of the Saudi tennis fans and the great atmosphere. I think the tournament will be unforgettable and perfect preparation for the new year for us players”, said Fritz in his pre-tournament preview.

He also told us why it’s so special playing the Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by

Aramco during the off-season: “We are always on the road and typically go to the same places every year, so every time I play somewhere new it’s a real pleasure. I’m excited to see the event, to play there and just have a great week.”

25-year-old Fritz is currently the highest-ranked tennis player from the US and recently (in October) entered the world top 10. He also reached his first Grand Slam quarter-final at Wimbledon. Now Fritz will play in Saudi Arabia for the first time. 🎾

HUBERT HURKACZ

SMART, *efficient* AND A REALLY NICE GUY

Passionate about tennis, competitive, but never a sore loser – that’s Hubert Hurkacz. The 25-year-old is the top Polish male player in history and has improved every year. He won his first 1000 Masters title in Miami last year and also reached his first Grand Slam semi-final. Aside from those tournaments, he often played at the top level in 2022 and finished the season as the 10th best player in

the world. Hubert Hurkacz will bring incredible tennis to the Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by Aramco, fans can be sure of that. And “Hubi” is clear about why everybody should come and watch him and his rivals.

For the fans: What is the most fascinating thing about the sport of tennis for you?

“It’s definitely more special watching tennis live than on TV. It’s

a little bit quicker when you watch tennis live and you can feel the whole atmosphere in the stadium. It’s very special!”

About the Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by Aramco: How important is it for you playing these big matches against great players during the off season?

“It’s a great opportunity playing tournaments like the Diriyah

Tennis Cup because you can give your best against some of the best players in the world. Also you can see things in your game you should improve during your off season and you still have some time to make adjustments by January.” 🎾



- Father, Alexander, and mother, Irina, are former pro tennis players who have served as his coach. His brother, Mischa, also plays on the ATP Tour.
- Alexander Zverev achieved a career-high No. 2 after his injury during the 2022 Roland Garros semi-final against Rafael Nadal.
- Alexander Zverev has set up the Alexander Zverev Foundation. The foundation will primarily support children suffering from diabetes (type 1). It will provide life-saving insulin and other essential medicines, including in developing countries.



He is one of the great players of his generation and a true champion: Alexander Zverev.

But before you, dear fans, cheer him onto the tennis court, let us introduce him to you. The 25-year old from Germany has been one of the best players in the world for years and reached his career high (ATP Ranking 2) this summer. The previous year was his most successful: Zverev led the ATP Tour with six titles in 2021. Besides his triumph at the Nitto ATP Finals, he won the gold medal at the Olympic Games in Tokyo, where he defeated world number one Novak Djokovic in the semis and Karen Khachanov in the final. This was the biggest and most emotional victory of his career. In June 2022 he injured his ankle during his French

Open semi-final against Rafael Nadal. At the Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by Aramco he is finally back on the grand stage of world tennis.

"I'm happy that I'm finally back on the court after my injury. It's even nicer that I can make my comeback before the official start of the 2023 season. I think the Diriyah Tennis Cup offers a very good opportunity for it and I'm looking forward to being in Saudi Arabia for the first time", said Zverev.

THE FORMAT

OF THE DIRIYAH TENNIS CUP PRESENTED BY ARAMCO

The Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by Aramco is an unforgettable tennis tournament that will be memorable for fans and players alike. Thanks to the special tournament format, the Diriyah Tennis Cup is sure to deliver many surprises.


A total of 12 players will compete against each other to win the tournament. The first four seeded players will receive a bye in the first round. The remaining first round matches and the quarter-final matches will all be played on the first day of the tournament, Thursday, December 8. On Friday, the semi-finals will be held and on the third day the two finalists will battle for the title of the Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by Aramco.

However, some of the players will compete not only against each

other, but also side by side. Because this year a doubles tournament will complement the singles competition. To be precise, the players eliminated on the first day of the singles will start their own doubles tournament on Friday. As with the singles tournament, the semi-finals will be played on Friday and the doubles final on Saturday.

Matches will be played in singles and doubles best of three with regular scoring under the ITF Rules of Tennis, with the exception of the third set in which a match tie-break to 10 will be played in singles and doubles instead of a regular third set. The first round in singles (round of 16) will be best of three match tie-breaks to 10.

This promises to be a festival of tennis in a class of its own! 🎾



STAN WAWRINKA

“STAN THE MAN” IS BACK IN DIRIYAH!

He was one of the most popular players during the inaugural Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by Aramco 2019. Three years later, Stan Wawrinka from Switzerland will return to Saudi Arabia to delight the fans again at the Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by Aramco 2022!

“Stan the Man” is one of the most complete players in tennis – and a real fan favorite! The 37-year-old has now been on the ATP Tour for around 20 years, thrilling spectators around the world. Wawrinka is a three-time Grand Slam champion

and also won a gold medal in doubles alongside Roger Federer at the 2008 Summer Olympics. Furthermore, he has been ranked as high as No. 3 in the world and has been a firm fixture in the top rankings for many years.

In recent seasons, however, Wawrinka has struggled with injuries and most recently fought his way back after two operations last year. Now he is finding his form again! A few weeks ago he defeated the No. 3 in the world Casper Ruud in Basel and showed what achievements he is still

capable of at the age of 37. Now he will return to the Kingdom: “In 2019 I went to Saudi Arabia twice. It was something special, because tennis was new for them and everyone was really happy to see us and to come to our matches. I’m looking forward to being back”, Wawrinka said. 🎾

CAMERON NORRIE

STRONG FINISH TO A STRONG YEAR?



Great Britain's No.1 Cameron Norrie, who broke into the top 10 for the first time this year and reached his first Grand Slam semi-final at Wimbledon, is now competing at the Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by Aramco. We listened to what he had to say before the tournament got started.

What are your expectations about the Diriyah Tennis Cup?

"I think what I am expecting the most is that it will be very hot and sunny. We are coming from Europe where it's winter, so it's great for us to get some sun. I have seen some pictures on Instagram from Saudi Arabia and it seems like a fascinating place, so hopefully I'll get to explore as well as playing in the tournament.

When you practice with the best players in the world, you automatically raise your level. It's so great to get these matches in before the next season starts with the Australian Open."

Why should everyone in Saudi Arabia come to visit the tournament?

"There is such a huge difference between live tennis and watching tennis on TV. You can see the emotions of the players and hear the sound of the ball – I think tennis is one of the best sports in the world to see live rather than watching on TV." 🎾





I normally play internationally and a lot of the fans don't get to see me in action, so playing in front of everyone and bringing a higher level of tennis to Saudi is everything I could hope for", said Saud. 

After finishing his playing career in 2009, Johansson worked as a coach for various ATP and WTA players. Until the end of 2020 he coached David Goffin, who competed at the Diriyah Tennis Cup in 2019. Thomas Johansson is a true legend of tennis and a perfect addition to the team of experts. His coaching knowledge will be invaluable at the tennis try-outs which are part of the tournament.

Additionally, **Severin Lüthi** from Switzerland, the former coach of Roger Federer, will attend a special kids tennis clinic during the exhibition tournament. With his visit he complements the prominent squad of tennis experts.

CODE OF Conduct

How to behave as a spectator

We want your visit to the historic Diriyah Tennis Cup presented by Aramco to be truly enjoyable and memorable. To ensure spectators have the very best experience possible, please comply with the following code of conduct.

- Turn phones to silent during matches
- Stay seated until the players changes ends
- Keep quiet during points to not disturb the players
- Turn off the flash on your phone
- Treat the players, umpires and fellow spectators with respect
- Disorderly and antisocial behavior could see fans ejected from the Diriyah Arena

Top tips for tennis fans

- Arrive in advance to your seat
- Wear headgear and sunglasses for protection from the sun and use sunblock
- Drink plenty of water to avoid dehydration
- Bring warm clothes for the evenings
- There are no bag storage facilities

The following items are prohibited and may not be brought onto the premises

- Weapons, replica weapons or items resembling weapons
- Glass bottles or other blunt instruments
- Explosives, chemicals or incendiary devices
- Fireworks, flares, firecrackers
- Animals (save for trained assistance or guide dogs)
- Alcohol
- Illegal substances, including illicit drugs and needles (save as required for valid medical reasons)
- Poles, flagpoles, sticks, large photography equipment (e.g. tripods), bats
- Drones or unmanned aerial devices
- Electronic transmitting equipment or laser pointers
- Large objects such as suitcases / bags or items too large to be electronically screened
- Materials, objects or articles of political, ideological, philosophical or religious nature, that promotes the same, including, but not limited to, documents, flyers, banners, badges, insignia 🚫



HOW TO PLAY TENNIS –

Basic information

Tennis is a sport that can be played by two players (singles) or four players (doubles) and has existed in its current form since 1877.

Tennis is a very popular sport worldwide. The ITF Global Tennis Report 2019 estimated that a total of 87 million people play tennis around the world. Participation in tennis is very balanced between the sexes, with men making up 53% of players and women 47%. Tennis has also become a big business in which women in particular are very successful. Five of the ten best-paid female athletes in the world are tennis players (2021).

Scoring & winning a game

Players need to score four points to win a game of tennis.

The points are known as 15 (1 point), 30 (two points), 40 (three points) and the fourth results in the winning point and the end of that game.

If the scores go to 40-40, this is known as “deuce”. When a game reaches deuce, a player must go two points clear to win the game.

Winning the match

To win a match, a player must win two sets. One set is won by a player reaching 6 games and being at least 2 games clear of the opponent.

If the set goes to 6-6 it goes to a “tiebreak”, which is a deciding game played up to 7 points (the winner must be clear by at least 2 points). If a match goes to 1-1 in sets, the third set will be decided in a “match tiebreak”, in which the first player to reach 10 points (and be at least 2 points clear) wins the match.

A QUICK GUIDE

Rules

- The game starts with a coin toss to determine which player will serve first and from which end.
- The server must then serve each point from the base line, switching sides after each point. The server's feet may not move in front of the baseline on the court prior to hitting their serve.
- If the server fails to get their first serve in, they may take a second serve. If they fail to get their second serve in, a double fault will be called and the point will be lost .
- If the server clips the net but the ball lands in the service box, a "let" is called and they may serve again without penalty. If the ball hits the net and fails to go in the service box, it is called "out" and they lose that serve.
- The receiver may stand where they wish to return the serve. If the ball is struck without the serve bouncing then the server will receive the point.
- Once a serve has been made, the number of shots between the players is unlimited. The point is won by hitting the ball so that the opponent fails to return it into the court.
- If a player touches the net, distracts the opponent or impedes them in any way, they automatically lose the point.
- The ball can hit any part of the line for the ball to be called in; when it lands outside the line, the ball is out.
- A player loses a point if they fail to return the ball into the opponent's court or if the ball bounces twice in their court. 🎾
